Studio School.






Each school is a discrete organisation and pupils may enter at any stage but all phases share common aims and values reflected in the distinctive uniform which is the same across the campus.

A house system operates across the Junior and High schools creating a common cause for all pupils and staff. The houses are named after Yorkshire creative artists: Armitage (Simon Armitage: poet), Castle (Roy Castle: musician) Hargreaves (Roger Hargreaves: author) and Stewart (Patrick Stewart: actor. The commitment to the highest standards of teaching and learning has been recognised in successive Ofsted reports and remains the cornerstone of each school's philosophy. Progress is tracked throughout a child's school career to ensure they can achieve their potential and parents are involved at every stage.

The schools share a common belief in the importance of home-school relationships and arrange regular open-access events for the community.

This prospectus gives an overview of the work and aspirations of all the schools comprising Netherhall Learning Campus.

Feeding into the Infant school, the Nursery department offers important experiences to children. They will learn through play, developing the ability to socialise and cooperate with others and becoming more confident and independent.

Parents and carers are regularly invited into school for Family Learning events to help them understand what their children are doing in class and to find out the best ways to help them at home.

Additionally, the school offers Resourced Provision places for students with special needs.

Rawthorpe St James is church-aided. The school is proud of its inclusive ethos which welcomes all faiths and none. Its core values were agreed by pupils, parents, carers and staff and are based on Christian principles.

As children grow older and move to the next stage of their schooling, it is important that they do so in a safe, happy and nurturing environment. Netherhall Juniors strives to create just this atmosphere by offering small, well-resourced classes taught by a highly-qualified and stable staff, many of whom have been at the school for at least five years.

In addition to their classroom experiences, pupils will have a wide range of opportunities to visit museums, galleries and theatres, as well as taking part in specialist workshops.

The school prides itself on its CLICK programme (Creative Learning Inspiring Clever Kids) in which teams of teachers from both the Infant and Junior phases work together to devise programmes of study around particular themes or topics. These programmes are both stimulating and fun and serve to widen the cultural and academic horizons of the pupils.

Some activities are specifically designed to stretch and inspire the most able while others seek to identify and remove the barriers to learning experienced by some children.

Individual attainment is rigorously monitored and pupils, parents and carers are kept informed of progress made in class.

Health and fitness are also important. As well as gymnastics and team games, pupils can experience a range of sports not normally included in the PE curriculum, for example fencing and archery, taught to them by specialist sportsmen and women.

Choosing which high school is right for your child is one of the most important decisions you will ever take.

Surveys of parents and carers who have transferred their child to Netherhall High School, show that there are a range of influencing factors.

NLC offers a choice of learning pathways covering the full age and ability range.
Students are able to make informed choices as early as Yr8 about the subjects they can follow, both academic and vocational.

Ensuring that pupils are happy and take pleasure in learning is a priority for Netherhall Learning Campus. OFSTED noted that the proportion of parents and carers reporting that their children enjoy school was "much higher than is usual." Pupils told the inspectors that instances of bullying, racist behaviour or homophobia were rare but, if it did happen, it was dealt with effectively.

Small class sizes and dedicated staff ensure that all children are known, recognised and receive personal attention.

A further strong reason for choosing NLC is the wide range of creative and artistic opportunities provided, all delivered in state-of-the-art accommodation. The school has a deservedly high reputation for the Arts and many pupils take advantage of this, both in class and as part of the wide range of extra-curricular activities on offer.

The Creative & Media

Studio School.

The Creative & Media Studio School offers a unique post-16 learning pathway for students across Kirklees.

As well as offering a range of nationally recognised qualifications, including 'A' level and BTEC, the College places the importance of enterprise and employability at the heart of the curriculum.

Students work in an informal, highlysupported environment with access to stateof-the-art equipment. They receive mentoring from education, creative, business and industry professionals who help them develop the skills they need to market and sell their creative talents.

Some students progress from CMSS to University or Art and Design College, others secure Apprenticeships. There is also a number of students who are running their own, successful businesses; businesses they conceived and developed whilst at the Creative & Media Studio School.
