Rewards EYFS



Children earn 5 stars then 7, 10 by Easter. This is for good pieces of work, understanding, applying knowledge in continuous areas.

It is explained to children why they have earned the sticker. They can then select treat from the reward box. When the star is completed a new star begins.

KS1



Sticker Chart:

Children are rewarded for anything over and beyond with a sticker and/or a pebble.

On a Friday lunch it is decided who has the most stickers. This child then receives a reward from the treat box.

Star of the Week



One child is selected each week for work/learning or behaviour which is over and beyond. This is celebrated in assembly and the pupil eats Lunch on the VIP table

Golden Chair



A reward given in each classroom for amazing work, kindness, learning over and above, children showing they are good citizens and are

always engaged.

Thinking Chair

A consequence strategy used for behaviour which is not following our school rules.

First warning given (time to comply), then second warning (time to comply). If behaviour does not improve pupils will be sent to the thinking chair. A clear reason will be given as to why they are being sent.

When it is time to leave the thinking chair the adult will reinforce the message and make sure the child has understood.

"Why did I sit you here? What could you do differently?"

This is always followed by one adult so that the child is not confused

Pebbling



We use pebbles and pots in classrooms and throughout school to praise positive behaviour and good learning as soon as we see it. It is a great way to reward and challenge at the same time. When we give the pebble we show the pebble to the child and tell them why they are receiving it.

The pebbles are then placed into class reward jar, when this is full the whole class receives a treat.
