Events and Trips

There have been so many amazing events and visits that have taken place this last term as a result of the hard work and dedication of our staff:-

Year 9 Tropical World Visit

Our Year 9 Geographers recently had an amazing day at Tropical World learning about different ecosystems and adaptations. Mrs. Jones said they were an absolute credit to themselves and the school in terms of their behaviour and attitude.

CMSS Year 12 Music & Media Trip

The CMSS Year 12 Music and Media classes and Mr Kirk had the privilege of visiting Spirit Studios in Manchester – a professional recording studio, with industry standard equipment. They were given a tour round the building, with explanations on the functions and uses of different sound desks in different rooms. The place where the true magic happened for our group was the Charlie Jones Live Venue, where everyone got a chance to perform and produce.

Liverpool British Music Experience Years 7, 8, 9 and 10

Medication

Uniform

I would like to take the opportunity to revisit the uniform expectations. Uniform is an important part of a school's identity. It reinforces who we are as a community and helps allow students to feel pride in their school. It also helps prepare students for life after school where many will have to dress smartly for work. It would be fair to say that recently, we have a number of interpretations of what is and is not acceptable uniform and we believe it is time to clarify our expectations for students and parents.

Choosing our school for your child's education, you are agreeing to abide by our policies and as such the school would have the final say on what is deemed acceptable uniform.

In such instances where uniform has not met expected standards, parents / carers will be contacted and students will be asked to borrow from the Pastoral Support Team or sent home to change. If they refuse or are unable to go home to change they will spend the rest of the day in isolation. We will be enforcing the uniform policy when we return after Easter with zero tolerance of infringements. If you have any questions about the guidance, please do not hesitate to contact school or refer to the uniform policy on the website. If you are unsure whether a piece of uniform is acceptable, please consult the school before buying.
