Geography

This term, our Year 10 Geography students have taken part in two highly successful fieldwork trips to Leeds City


Centre and Redcar Beach — vital experiences as they prepare for their GCSE Paper 3 exam next year.

In Leeds, students explored the regeneration of the **Victoria Gate shopping centre**. They conducted surveys, completed questionnaires, and engaged directly with the public to assess how successful the redevelopment has been. It was a fantastic opportunity for students to apply classroom learning to the real world and develop key fieldwork and analytical skills. Students also headed to **Redcar Beach**, where they studied coastal processes in action and enhanced their learning in the classroom.



Both trips were valuable and gave students the chance to work collaboratively, develop enquiry-based skills and experience learning outside the classroom. We're proud of their efforts and we're confident these experiences will equip them as they move into Year 11. - Mrs Chapman





Criminology

Students were immersed in a journey through the criminal justice system with an ex SIO who guided them through the case at hand. What better way to end an era than with a tour to Paris with the NLC Music Department? 

Disposable Vape Ban - June 2025

As of June 1st 2025, it will be illegal to sell, supply or possess for sale or supply any single-use (disposable) vapes, including non-nicotine versions.



The ban aims to reduce environmental damage caused by vapes in landfill and cut the number of young people vaping.

For some young people who have grown up with vapes and are already addicted, this could be a challenging time.

Retailers selling disposable vapes after 1st June can be reported anonymously to <u>Crimestoppers</u>.
