



HD5 COMMUNITY HUB ACHIEVEMENTS FROM SEPTEMBER 2025 TO DECEMBER 2026

- Breakfast club fed 8546 mouths across the campus with 3717 at the High School, 2833 at the Juniors and 1996 at the Infants.
- 126 food parcels were given out.
- Fundraisers held including a jumble sale; coffee mornings, yummy afternoon tea and a Christmas fayre. Our hub pupils have done some amazing community work and our AP pupils are turning into master chefs!!
- £3,000 worth of fruit and vegetables supplied.
- Household support grant supported 52 families with over 240 individuals receiving Christmas presents, help with gas/electric and/or food vouchers.
- People took courses on cooking and baking, ESOL classes; some are on their way to working in schools qualifications; many have taken part in information sessions around domestic abuse for adults and studio school pupils; as well as providing arts and craft sessions; winter warmers; IT basics; maths for beginners; mental health in the workplace to name a few! All our courses are free of charge.

A few of the students who visited went on to secure a weeks work experience for the Summer and all the students were invited to take part in paid opportunities at Easter!


Kirklees College Engineering Fair



BRITISH

The Under 13 girls (Years 7/8) have had an incredible run in this year's English Schools Football Association competition, showing determination, skill and fantastic team spirit throughout every round.



These performances earned them a place in the last 16 out of 216 teams in the English Schools competition, where they welcomed St Benet Biscop Academy from East Northumberland and Berwick. 



Parents and visitors were able to view the work on display. It was a fantastic way to recognise the hard work and talent of our students.





WORLD BOOK DAY[®]


“I want to thank all staff and students for the success of World Book Week 2026. The school community commitment to reading for pleasure was met with such high standards!

My assemblies received an incredible, engaged response, with many students taking the time to thank me for a wonderful presentation. I gave students and staff an insight into how I got into reading and why it is important to me. This resonated with students, encouraging lovely conversations around reading and the types of texts that students are interested in. The assemblies were also a fantastic opportunity to celebrate and recognise the reading success of students in each year group that have achieved amazing reading records on the Sparx Reader platform.

One of the thrive sessions for this week included the importance of reading for pleasure, allowing students to reflect on the types of texts that they enjoy reading and thinking about what they would like to read in the future.
