



Professional Practice

In Progression next term Y12 Students will commence working to secure their two week placement in a creative workplace, Experience shows that the earlier contact is made with companies the more chance students have of enjoying a stimulating and meaningful placement - competition is fierce! In previous years Students have worked with a variety of local and national companies to great success with many subsequently being offered full and part time roles and apprenticeships, it really is a chance to impress a potential employer. This Year Art & Textiles student Italia worked with Oxfam Online Hub in Batley, one of the principal online presences for the Oxfam Online Shop who focus on showcasing fabulous donations, offering the most distinctive, sought after and valuable pieces to a worldwide audience.

They aim to offer a broad range of items to appeal to everyone, from designer fashion and luxury accessories to technical sportswear and unique vintage pieces from bygone eras. Feedback from Manager Holly Bentley was outstanding and Italia had this to say about her experience "I volunteered at Oxfam Online Hub as a two-week work placement. Gaining skills such as organisation and independence, throughout the tasks of online website listing, garment sorting, and dispatch. I'm glad I have experienced this as it has given me a big insight into the fashion industry, which allows me to take and show off decision-making

skills to any new employment opportunities at university. My knowledge of fashion trends and styling was important whilst website listing as I had to explain to the customer what the clothing piece could be paired with. I really enjoyed this as I was determined to help Oxfam as a whole and as a result I raised £361, which is enough to provide clean safe water to 361 people, feed 45 families or install 18 toilets.

From working in the photography sector at Oxfam I've gained transferable skills such as communication and technical skills such as using a camera, software use, and photoshoot equipment. When using their photography editing media viewer software, I had to use tools for alignment, cropping, and background editing, which is a photoshoot post-production process. This helped to give a high-quality professional impact on the final picture, ready to be used on the website."

WW1 Centenary

We are incredibly of our Head Student Ambassador Poppy McCabe, Y13 Student Poppy travelled out to Ypres, Belgium with the West Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service Band along with other bands to form a mass band leading memorial



march through Ypres and to play at the Last Post and Remembrance Day Ceremonies at the Menin Gate to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the end of the Great War

The West Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service Band is Yorkshire's premier "Military Style" Concert band and Marching band, based in Birkenshaw, West Yorkshire proudly representing one of the national Emergency Services. The band boasts some 30+ volunteer musicians, from all walks of life and is one of just four "Military Style" Fire Service bands in the country.

Poppy says that being part of a marching band is something she has always aspired to and was delighted when she auditioned for a place with her saxophone and "passed with flying colours". Poppy plays alto sax with WYFRS band, attending weekly rehearsals at the fire station Fire band are selected for many different types of concerts, from a "last night of the proms" theme concert to events like BBC Carfest. Poppy was proud and nervous in equal measure ahead of the weekend which was packed with emotion. The Menin gate is the largest memorial to World War one with 55,000 names commemorated there. The event was live on Belgian TV, and also shown on large screens in Ypres market square. The turnout was around 30,000 spectators.

Y12 Charlotte Hirst wins a place on the 2019 BFI Film Academy Residential Programme in Screenwriting

We are delighted to announce that Y12 Student Charlotte has been awarded a place on this prestigious course, one of only 25 places awarded nationally! Charlotte impressed during her recent time working with the BFI after securing a place on the BFI Academy in October culminating in a premiere of her film collaboration in December

The BFI Film Academy provides opportunities for young people between the ages of 16-19 to develop new skills and build a career in the film industry, no matter where they live or what their background. Delivered at the historic Tyneside Cinema in Newcastle upon Tyne, the BFI Film Academy Residential Programme in Screenwriting offers an amazing opportunity for 25 young UK writers to take part in an intensive training programme to kick-start a career in the film industry.

Participants work throughout with script editors to create their own screenplay, and the programme offers:

- An exclusive insider's view of how to break into the film business
- The opportunity to work with a mentor to produce your own short film script
- Development of the craft skills necessary to succeed as a screenwriter
- The chance to network with leading professionals working in the British film industry today

Charlotte told me she is thrilled to have this opportunity to network and develop her skills alongside her studies at the Studio School and can't wait for February

Following the success of her work experience in London at the Savoy Theatre and English National Opera Y13 Georgina Cooper spent the summer with National Youth Theatre at the Rose Bruford College in London working long hours on their costume course. NYT delivered training on how to design a costume from a text, developing this into patterns to make a final costume. As well as collaborating with the actors on their devised performances Georgina worked in small production teams for each show which allowed her to take on individual roles such as costume supervisor to source all the costumes working long hours the experience taught her how to work on devised pieces which are changing even up to the day of the performance giving the added task of finding alternatives to costumes cut with little notice. Not one to rest on her Laurels Georgina moved straight on to her next project designing and creating costumes for "Gentlemen prefer Blondes" with Carlinghow Theatre company before taking on her first paid dresser/wardrobe assistant job at the Victoria Theatre, Halifax for their 2018 Pantomime: Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs. Georgina was fortunate to be taken to London to see Hamilton as a well done for her part in the Spenborough Youth Theatre working on the Jo Cox memorial prodiction of Les Miserable. 












/ART & DESIGN.


Year 12 have jumped into their beautiful body painting illusion images and produced some amazing looks!

Nicole Eves, 21, Freelance Broadcast Journalist, Part-time retail assistant

What did you study at the studio school and why,

At the Studio School I studied Performing Arts, English and Business.

I always had a passion for performing and writing and I knew business would be a practical qualification to have as it covered a wide range of business related topics.

I passed with a C in English, a Distinction/Merit in performing Arts and a Merit in business studies.

What additional skills/ experience did you gain from coming to the studio school?

While I was at the Studio School I had the opportunity to become a student journalist for one of the businesses which worked within the school Fourteen19. During this placement I interviewed the likes of Olympic Gold Medallist Ed Clancy, founder of the MOBO awards Kanya King and the Duke of York. It also pushed me towards my decision of studying Broadcast Journalism at University.

What was a highlight of your time here?

I think the highlight of my time at the Studio School was the opportunities we had, being able to interview such high profile people at a young age was amazing and put me in great stead for University and still to this day looks great on my CV. I don't feel like I would have had the same opportunities had I studied elsewhere.

Why did you choose to go uni?

Originally I planned to go to University to study Performing Arts, but during my final year of college I began to consider different options. I knew I loved being behind a camera or centre stage, but I also loved writing and telling stories, which led me to look into Broadcast Journalism. With this course I had the chance to be on camera, write stories, create content and just combine all of the skills I had and things I enjoyed doing.

I graduated last July with a 2.1 degree with honours and a BJTC qualification in Broadcast Journalism.

How did you go about getting freelance work?

Getting into freelancing was and is still difficult.

My course at University focused on TV and radio and I realised I enjoyed radio more. During my final year I had the opportunity to go on a placement at a radio station in Leeds and after over a year of unpaid work and proving myself, I finally had the opportunity to begin getting paid for my work. By no means was it easy and there were so many times when I felt like my hard work was never going to pay off, but I stuck at it, showed them my determination and now I'm finally getting regular paid work.

What are the downsides to this?

The downside to freelancing in this industry is it's very cut throat, there is so many people wanting to do the same thing and not enough space for everyone. I've realised this last year that it's a lot about who you know in this industry - although my

qualifications are necessary - a lot of the work I get is from word of mouth and stations passing my name around which is why I always have to make sure my work is top standard. Another downside is work isn't always regular. At the moment I have regular freelancing work but it's never guaranteed, which is why I still keep my part-time job in a supermarket and luckily they understand my schedule. I definitely wouldn't give up my part-time income while I'm working as a freelancer.

What is next for you?

What is next for me? I'm going to continue to freelance as a Broadcast Journalist for radio stations until I get the opportunity to work for a station as a full-time employee.

I'm about to begin a new freelancing contract with a TV production company in Manchester as I'm wanting to get back into TV

Finally my friend from University and I are working on a few projects together, we have recently been commissioned to create a promotional video for a plastic surgeon, we begin filming at the end of March and in the future we're hoping to make it more into a business rather than just a hobby, and be able to create promotional videos and short films for a variety of people, businesses and charities

But of course, in the mean time you will still catch me working in the supermarket a few days a week.
