7	4	Every lesson will include a 'live' element. At least two lessons each week will be fully teacher-led with students joining in through Teams chat. Students will follow what their teacher is doing in their home learning workbook, taking notes and answering questions, just as they would in class. Tasks will be uploaded to the group Files area for students to download or instead viewed on screen. The other lessons will also include the completion of specified tasks on Hegarty Maths, with teachers on hand through Teams chat to assist and advise as needed – see below

11	4	At least once per week, Year 11 students will have one of their lessons replaced with a set of GCSE questions; either a previous exam paper or a set of exam-style problems related to recent topic. These questions will be uploaded to the group Files area for students to download or view on screen.
12	1	Students resitting GCSE Maths will have one teacher-led lesson each week, with students working along with the teacher in their home learning workbook. In between lessons, tasks will be set using Hegarty Maths to practise skills.

Additional Information

We expect students to present all written work in their home learning book just as neatly as they do in lessons. Where practical, we will ask students to share images of their book work so that we can help them improve and make some assessments about the progress they are making. We are looking forward to seeing home learning books when students return to school as lockdown restrictions ease over time.

Work set on Hegarty Maths always has a written component. Students are expected to work through the video clip, pausing it to try out questions and then watching the answers to check their work. They will be drawing diagrams, writing working out and doing calculations on paper before typing the answers into the online quiz. The Hegarty system allows us to give short feedback for each question and students can also type in comments with each answer that we will review weekly. Once a task is completed, students are given a percentage to show them how well they have learned the skill – we would expect them to have another go or to try out the identified Building Blocks if they don't understand a task.

Please note that if a member of staff is ill, or cannot otherwise teach a 'live' lesson, then students will be notified through Teams chat and instructions will be given.
